Mr. Hoover called the meeting to order and led the assemblage in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Hoover deferred from the regular order of business to permit Mayor Perry to present his 2017 Good Neighbor Award to Mr. Russ Drenning. Mayor Perry spoke of how Mr. Drenning watches over the neighborhood and how he organized the fundraiser for Bill Fischer.

Motion by Baburich, seconded by Miller, to approve the minutes of the last regular meeting. Motion was unanimous.

Motion by Hensell, seconded by Drenning, to approve the bank balances as read. Motion was unanimous.

Motion by Drenning, seconded by Syska, to approve for payment the bills for the month after being properly countersigned. Motion was unanimous.

Motion by Hensell, seconded by Syska, to approve the Tax Collection report as read. Motion was unanimous.

**MAYOR**

For the month of June there were 20, 911 calls and 137 regular patrols by F.H.P.D. the majority of the 911 calls were:

Mayor Perry reminded all to be vigilant, proactive and to call the police when necessary.

### **FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION**

Dr. Pustorino gave an overview of the new borough website.

Dr. Pustorino reported that the 12 municipalities presented the Woodland Hills School Board with a letter at last month's meeting and this month, letters were also sent to various state departments requesting their involvement.

Motion by Pustorino, seconded by Baburich, to transfer \$13,000 from the General Fund Money Market to the General Fund Checking. Motion carried.

### **PERMITS AND ORDINANCES**

There were no occupancy permit inspections.

There were 45 complaints, 10 citations issued and one was resolved.

Ms. Baburich stated that she will look into Ms. Fullwood's bush complaint. Ms. Fullwood asked if the code officer prioritizes issues in some manner and council responded that they have offered some suggestions about the borough's priorities.

There was a brief discussion about drivers ignoring the speed limit and stop signs.

### **ROADS AND PUBLIC WORKS**

Nine street name signs were identified for replacement and have been ordered.

The DPW has been asked to address potholes in the alley behind Fairview and on Shadeland behind Tugboats. Ms. Fullwood stated that she was pleased that the potholes were patched on North.

The stop sign blinkers can be either battery operated (as the borough currently has) or solar operated.

### **HEALTH AND SANITATION**

Storm sewers need to be repaired on North Avenue. The engineer will get bids.

Motion by Hensell, seconded by Drenning, to authorize the borough engineer to have an emergency manhole installed at 140 Highland Avenue for a lateral repair. Motion carried.

### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

There were four alarms for the VFC. A description of the calls and number of members attending each was read.
