STORM SEWERS/RECYCLING

When the urge to spring clean hits you please don't get the urge to toss hazardous materials down the storm sewers. That includes paint, chemicals, liquid solvents, yard waste or anything else considered noxious. Ideally, the way to dispose of this type of waste is through a recycling program. The PRC (Pennsylvania Resources Council) has a household chemical recycling event in our area on August 17, 2024 at Boyce Park. For more information phone 412-488-7490. The PRC also sponsors "Hard to Recycle" events around the area. The next one is at the Galleria in Pittsburgh Mills on May 11th and Next Tier Connect in Monroeville on October 5th. MOWING

Grass cutting time is here. Chalfant's ordinance requires a moratorium on noise between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. daily. Be mindful of your sleeping neighbor when revving up the lawnmower and consider also they may not be a fan of Metallica blaring from your outdoor speakers. Sweeping grass off the street looks good and also keeps it out of the storm sewers.

FIRE/POLICE/DPW

To reiterate, our Borough is protected by the Forest Hills Fire Department, Police Department, and Department of Public Works. Wilkins 3 Fire may also respond to any fire call from Chalfant. If you have received a donation letter from Forest Hills Fire Dept. be advised it is a voluntary donation.

INFORMATION FROM OUR TAX COLLECTOR

Reminder that the Borough 2024 taxes are due on April 30, 2024 to be eligible for the discount amount. You may mail your payment, drop it off at 144 Lynnwood Ave (Borough Office) or come into the office on April 23rd to April 26th and April 29th and 30th from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. to pay your taxes in person. It is always a pleasure to see our neighbors.

Woodland Hills School District 2024 Taxes will be mailed out on July 1, 2024. If you don't receive a tax bill within 7 days of that date, please contact me. WHSD taxes are payable at a DISCOUNT by August 31, 2024 and FACE value by October 31, 2024. After October 31 taxes will be in penalty value. If paying on the WHSD installment plan payments are due 1) October 31, 2024 2) January 31, 2025 and 3) Final payment due March 31, 2025. If you have paid off your mortgage or just purchased a home in the Borough or refinanced or changed mortgage companies, it is YOUR responsibility as the property owner to advise the following:

1. Notify your local tax collector 2. Notify Allegheny County Department of Real Estate (412-350-4100) to update your billing address 3. Notify your home insurance carrier.

It is the Property Owner's responsibility to notify these people and /or agencies of any change to the mailing of tax bills. Not receiving a tax bill DOES NOT relieve you of paying your taxes. All tax payments are accepted at the Borough office located at 144 Lynnwood Ave, either by postage mail or dropped off. DO NOT USE THE FIRE DEPT. MAIL SLOT ON ROSSMORE AVE.

FLAG FLYING ETIQUETTE AND RULES

Here are some tips for hanging the American Flag properly on the Fourth of July, Flag Day and every other day of the year.

Flags are meant to be displayed from sunrise to sunset. You can fly the flag at night, but if you do, it should be illuminated.

The flag should never touch the ground, the floor, or anything that may sit beneath it, including tables, chairs, railings, and bushes.

There is a difference between "half-staff" and "half-mast". Half-mast technically refers to a flag flown on a ship's mast, while half-staff describes the flags flown on land, though they are commonly used interchangeably. (Flags should be flown at "half-staff" until noon on Memorial Day.)

It is against the official Flag Code to hang a tattered flag. If yours is in bad shape, you can wash it, dry-clean and/or sew it.

Unsalvageable flags should be dropped off at a local American Legion or VFW for retirement or burned discreetly.
